GRANT AWARDS FOR COMMUNITY GOOD

This year marked the close of our much appreciated \$150,000 National Endowment for the Arts grant which helped get local organizations through the struggles of pandemic closures. It also marked the beginning of two Sierra Nevada Conservancy grants totaling \$1.46M to perform environmental analysis in the Sherwins area, and the construction of a new Sherwins Meadow Trailhead.
